Objectives:

- Overcoming the fragmentation of the EU security market
- Reducing the gap from research to market
- Better integration of the societal dimension



Follow-up activities in the Crisis Management area

via a new request to CEN related to M/487

- *Crisis management glossary (based on the Societal security Terminology ISO 22300:2012)*
- *Semantic and organizational standards: Organizational model to facilitate interoperability of command and control centres*
- *Guidance in crisis response planning: Guidance for emergency response planning (risk based planning, information sharing, incident qualification, decision-making under uncertainty)*
- *Guidance in crisis response planning: Debrief principles for Pan-European exercises and cross-border crises (development of good practices for cooperation and coordination between Member States)*



Follow-up activities in the CBRN-E area

via a new request to CEN related to M/487 the Commission asked for a European standard

- *Serving as glossary for the CBRN-E area*
- *Streamlining education, exercise and training in the CBRN-E area*
- *On CBRN-E in Health Care facilities*
- *Serving for full facepiece air purifying respirators*

DRS-6-2015: Addressing standardisation opportunities in support of increasing disaster resilience in Europe

- ✓ Assessment of feasibility and impact of standardisation activities not included in priorities identified by the M487 mandate in the area of disaster resilience (including CBRN-E threats)
- ✓ Target users such as standardisation bodies, security agents, civil protection units
- ✓ EU tentative funding 1-2 MEUR
- ✓ Type of action: CSA
